Steering Committee Model

- The steering committees are designed to bring together the thought leadership imbedded within the members focussing on three key themes of Vibrancy, Community and Enterprise.

- Provides an opportunity for participation, recognition of membership, a networking opportunity with like-minded members and a future source of Board members.
- Assists the Committee in delivering strategic outcomes though stronger engagement with the members and community.
- Helps to identify opportunities for Committee positioning in the lead up to the 2026 State election.

Structure

- One steering committee per theme.
- Participants will be drawn from all membership classes with maximum of 20 people per committee.
- Expression of interest will be called at each AGM for participation in the committees for the next calendar year.
- At least three meetings with a summary report of activities to be delivered at the AGM each year.
- Focus and policy areas to be developed at the first meeting of each year in consultation with CE and Committee for Adelaide Board.
- Success will be measured by reference to the identification of opportunities to drive thought leadership, develop advocacy, dialogue between business, academic institutions and government on key policy areas.
